★ **VOTE EARLY USING A MAIL-IN ABSENTEE BALLOT. REQUEST YOUR BALLOT TODAY!**

1. To request an absentee ballot use this link:

<https://vote.elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation/Lookup/absentee>

OR call your registrar's office at the numbers above.

2. As soon as you receive your ballot, VOTE! Carefully follow the instructions including signing the first ballot envelope. Return it either by mail or in person to your registrar's office. Mail your ballot before October 25 to ensure that it arrives in time to be counted.

 Transportation:

1. GRTC has begun an hourly shuttle service for voting. It will pick up passengers Monday through Friday on the north side of City Hall at the intersection of Ninth and Marshall streets and on West Broad Street near the front of the Science Museum of Virginia.

Weekday trips at City Hall begin at 7:45 a.m., with the last trip leaving the registrar's office at 5:15 p.m. The shuttles will stop at the Broad Street stop along the way to the NEW registrar's office, which is at 2134 W. Laburnum Ave.

The election office is open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on the two Saturdays before the Nov. 3 election from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. GRTC will operate the shuttles on those Saturdays as well.

In the week before Election Day, Richmond will open two additional voting sites, City Hall and Hickory Hill Community Center, which will be open from Oct. 24 through Oct. 31. The city also will have drop-off ballot boxes.

2. St. Peter's will provide transportation for early in person voting on Friday, October 9. The van will leave from St. Peter's, 1719 N. 22<sup>nd</sup> St., at 10:00 a.m. To reserve a spot on the van call or email us. If you requested and have received a paper absentee ballot you must bring that with you. Bring you government issued photo I.D. and wear your mask.

If you need transportation but cannot go on October 9, please contact us and we will try to arrange another day for you.

Limited transportation can be provided on election day, November 3, with a prior reservation. The deadline to register for transportation for Nov. 3 is Tuesday, October 20.
